Does the portfolio rebalance?

22/02/2024	<p>Governed Retirement Income Portfolio 4</p> <p>Equity markets have continued to climb over the recent weeks, supported by decent Q4 corporate earnings and improvements in business optimism. We remain overweight equities and have added to this position as both macro and technical factors remain supportive for the asset class. Elsewhere we remain underweight commodities and have deepened this position more recently as weaker Chinese demand data has seen the asset class continue to trend lower. We remain modestly underweight property.</p>

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Effective Date of Change	Overview of Changes
01/02/2024	<p>Governed Retirement Income Portfolio 4</p> <p>Stock markets have had a positive start to the year, with the S&P 500 having advanced for 12 of the last 13 weeks to leave this index at fresh all-time highs. We remain overweight equities and have added to this position as technical support for the asset class remains strong. Elsewhere we remain underweight commodities. However, as geopolitical risk and tight supply factors have helped the asset class performance over recent weeks, we have reduced the size of this underweight position. We remain modestly underweight property.</p>

Effective Date of Change	Overview of Changes
18/01/2024	<p>Governed Retirement Income Portfolio 4</p> <p>Stock markets have taken a breather this year after very strong performance in Q4 2023. We remain overweight equities and have added to our position at lower levels, with investor sentiment having neutralised from exuberant levels and seasonal period still positive for the asset class. Elsewhere we are moving further underweight commodities which continue to struggle at the broad level, even despite ongoing geopolitical risk in the Red Sea. Bond yields have risen this year, with central bankers pushing back on markets' excessive rate cut expectations; we remain broadly neutral the asset class. We remain modestly underweight property.</p>
